

n service to 4-string uke players and 6-string guitarists curious about the exuberant hot jazz of the 1920s-30s, *Jazzin' On 4 Strings* is a guide to the application of DGBE Chicago tuning on 4-string instruments like the tenor banjo and tenor guitar – for a more varied sonic palette.

The roots of the guitar-like "Chicago tuning" for the 4-string tenor banjo and tenor guitar are tangled, but the real-world application of the tuning is long-validated by New Orleans jazz banjo pioneers like Johnny St. Cyr – *and* rock-and-pop recording session masters like Tommy Tedesco.

In Jazzin' On 4 Strings, you'll learn about the hot jazz of the 1920s-30s; the rationale for Chicago tuning; 4-string chords and progressions; 4- and 8-string instruments suitable for Chicago tuning; and 20 hot jazz standards – all to welcome you into a world of fun, challenge, and musical discovery.
